Foundation Helps Local Men Become Police Officers and Deputies

The Mendocino Public Safety Foundation continues to provide financial support to local men and women who want to become peace officers in Mendocino County.

Damien Angell took the oath to become a deputy sheriff in December. He completed police academy with funding from the Foundation.

Cesar Mendoza began police academy in January with our financial support. Upon completion he will go to work as a Ukiah police officer.

Both men had their tuition and expenses at police academy paid by a scholarship-loan from the Foundation. No repayment is required provided that they serve for at least 3 years as local peace officers. The scholarship-loan program helps recruitment and retention of local residents as peace officers.

Sheriff Allman commented, "We are starting to see some wonderful results by recruiting local residents who possess a strong desire to make Mendocino County a safer place for everyone. The contributions which we have received are the number one reason we are able to send local people to school."

"Jerry," a new K-9 dog, has joined the Fort Bragg Police Department to provide officer protection and narcotics detection. Jerry was purchased and trained with a grant from the Mendocino Public Safety Foundation.

The Mendocino Public Safety Foundation was formed in 2011. So far we have raised \$112,000 and provided the following support for local law enforcement:

- Purchased a bloodhound for the Sheriff's Department and a K-9 for Fort Bragg police.
- Purchased a tactical robot for Ukiah police department for use in bomb detection and hostage situations.
- Funded a seminar on helping peace officers and their families cope with the emotional stress of police work.
- Awarded six scholarships for local men to attend police academy so they can accept positions as peace officers in Mendocino County.
